WM. A. BRADY HURT IN MOTOR ACCIDENT

Jules E. Goodman and John 'Turk Also Injured as Manager's Car Breaks Down.

TAKEN TO JERSEY HOSPITAL

Mishap Occurs After the First Production in Plainfield of "The Man Who Came Back."

PLAINFIELD, N. J., Aug. 27:—William A. Brady, theatrical producer of Manhattan; Jules Eckert Goodman, author of "The Man Who Came Back," and John Turk, business manager for Mr. Brady, were badly injured shortly before midnight last night in an automobile accident near Dunellen. All three are in the Muhlenberg Hospital here, recovering from injuries and shock.

Mr. Brady came here last night to witness the opening performance of "The Man Who Came Back" at the Plainfield Theatre. With him were Mr. Goodman and Mr. Turk. They remained in the theatre until the close of the show, and then made preparations to start for Wilmington, Del., where the play is to have another tryout tomorrow night.

The three men got into Mr. Brady's large auto, driven by his chauffeur, and everything went well until the party was near Dunellen. Then the rear axle broke and a wheel came off, causing the car to skid to one side of the road. The three men, riding in the rear seat of the motor, were hurled out and thrown into a ditch.

They were rushed to the Muhlenberg Hospital here early this morning. It was said at the hospital tonight that all three were badly bruised, but would be able to leave for New York tomorrow.
