

WOMAN AUTO VICTIM. DEAD.

Stanbery, Who Was Riding with Mrs. Westphal, to be Arraigned.

PLAINFIELD, July 25.—Mrs. William A. Westphal died to-day of injuries received in an automobile accident while riding with William R. Stanbery in Dunellen Sunday night.

Stanbery, who is President of the Watchung Silk Manufacturing Company of this city will appear before Justice Campbell in Dunellen to-morrow on several charges. One complaint is made by Oscar Harris, whose horse was killed by Stanbery's automobile. Marshal Mohan of Dunellen charges Stanbery with reckless driving and with failing to have lights on his machine.

County Physician Westcott granted permit for the burial of Mrs. Westphal to-day without holding an inquest.

Mrs. Westphal was the wife of William A. Westphal of Union County. At one time she was an active worker in the Church of the Holy Cross. When she was dying she made all arrangements for her funeral.
