

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12.—So far as official advices show, there were only two Americans killed in the explosion at Bas Obispo to-day. These were John J. Reidy, a foreman, of Indianapolis, Ind., and James L. Hummer, steam shovel crane-man of Dunnellen, N. J.

Only a brief message came from Chairman Goethals of the commission, and it was addressed to Capt. Frank C. Boggs, chief of the Washington office of the commission. It gave no details, but in accordance with a request it bore Michael Reidy, 1,634 Washington Street, Indianapolis, Ind., father of Foreman Reidy, and Mrs. George Edmondson, 646 Forty fifth Street, Brooklyn, and Mrs. M. F. Hummer of Dunnellen, N. J., sister and mother respectively of the other victim, were notified to-night of the accident.
