TRIBUTES TO FITZSIMMONS.

Sporting Folk Hold Memorial Services for Late Champion.

Memorial services were held in the Campbell Funeral Church, at Sixty-sixth Street and Broadway, yesterday for "Bob" Fitzsimmons, who died in Chicago last Sunday. Pugilists of the past and present, sporting folk who had known him as one of America's greatest ring fighters, and intimate friends of the man himself, participated in a final tribute to his memory. Jim Corbett, whom Fitzsimmons vanquished in the ring, delivered a tribute to his former adversary which stirred many of the men present to tears. He spoke of "Bob's" gallantry as a fighter, and of his capacity for friendship as a man.

The services were conducted by the Rev. Nathan A. Seagle of St. S'ephen's Protestant Episcopal Church. The personal side of the prizefighter's life was presented in an address by Dr. John Hendrick of Dunnellen, N. J., where

Fitzsimmons lived.
