STRICKEN AS HE GOT OFF CAR.

Man Believed to be William H. Haynes Expired Suddenly at Dunellen, N. J.

PLAINFIELD, N. J., Nov. 14.—A man, supposed to be William H. Haynes, of the firm of Haynes & Goodman, mattress makers of Washington Street, Brooklyn, died suddenly in Dunellen this afternoon. In his pockets were found cards of the firm mentioned, and several letters addressed to Mr. Haynes. Word was at once sent to Hopewell, near Trenton, where Mr. Haynes resides, but up to a late hour to-night no answer had been received.

The man was seen getting off a trolley car at Dunellen. He staggered a few steps, and then fell to the road unconscious. He was carried to a house nearby, where he died. Mr. Haynes usually rode through Dunellen to Bound Brook on the trolley line, and from Bound Brook to his home on the Philadelphia and Reading

Road.
